As Readers, we will continue to read our Little Wandle books to develop our decoding and comprehension skills.

As Mathematicians, we will develop our understanding of place value as well as adding and subtracting. We will use the White Rose planning and mastery approach to build on our problem-solving and reasoning skills. We will also develop fluency skills through using 'Mastering Number'.

As Scientists, we will be learning all about materials and their properties through fun, practical and engaging experiments.

As Geographers we will be learning all about the world's continents and oceans. Atlases, songs, books and IT will help us develop our understanding of the world we live in.

As Artists, we will be creating artwork based on the jungle. We will be studying the work of Henri Rousseau to inspire our own artwork and to learn new skills.

As Musicians, we will be using Music Express. Our first unit is all about 'Our bodies'.

In P.E, we will be developing our ball skills, which will help us to play team sports.

In Computing, we will be discussing online bullying , as well as learn the effective use of tools through digital painting.
